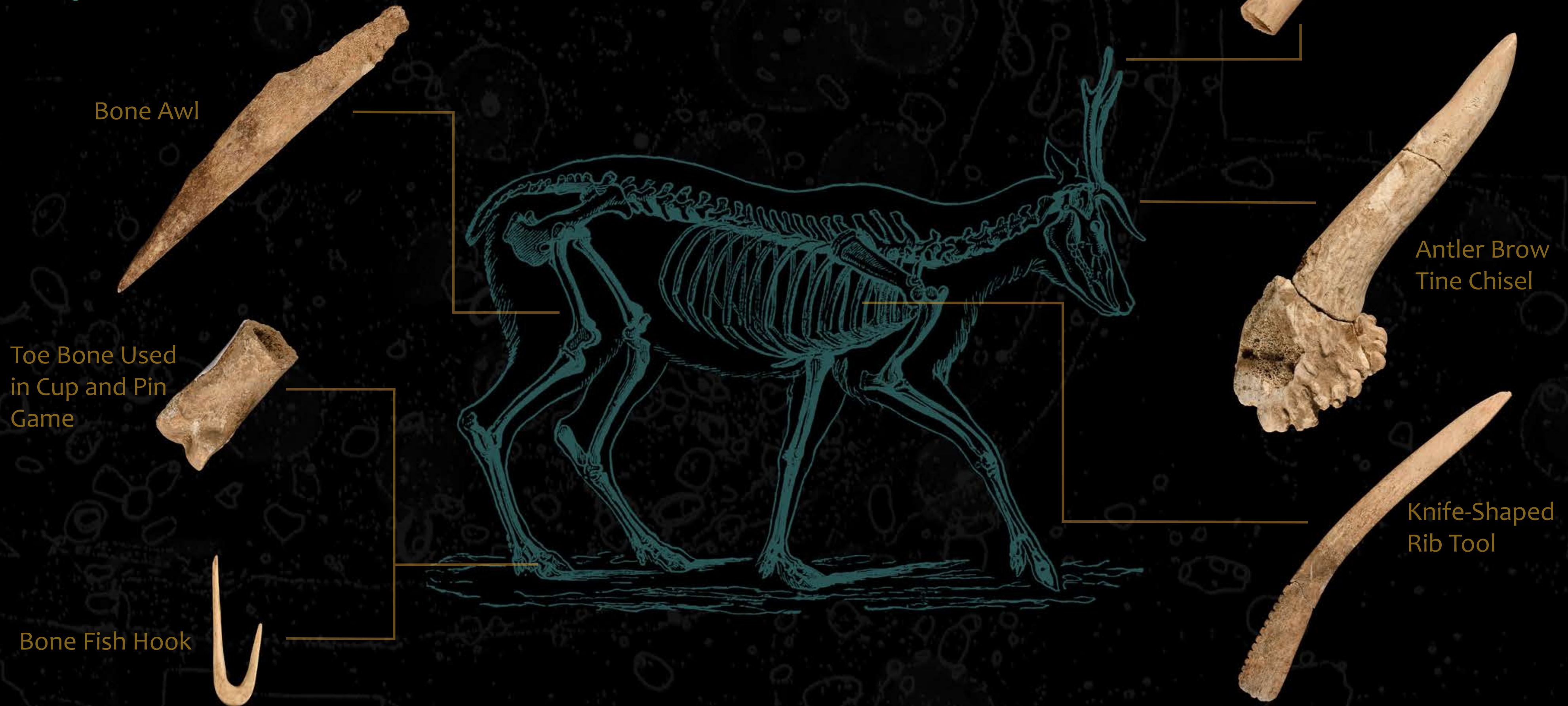


Bone Tools from Head to Toe

The Consol Site 36WM100

This Late Woodland period site near the Youghiogheny River in Westmoreland county was excavated by SPA Chapter 23. They uncovered a multi-component Monongahela village, carbon dated from 1109 AD. to 1452 AD. Deer and elk remains from the site suggests that there was a heavy reliance on these mammals for food, clothing, and tools.
